Staff Spotlight



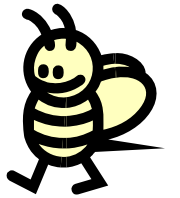
LACY HUTCHENS

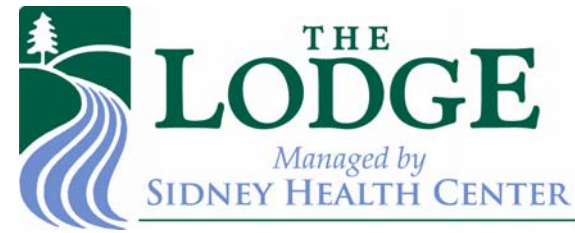
